#### *Important Guidelines that you should know.*

**BAPTISM:** Parents must show the desire to train their child in line with the teachings of the Catholic Church. Godparents must be a Confirmed, Active Catholic and complete a Godparent Affidavit.

**MARRIAGE PREPARATION:** The Church, in her pastoral concern for persons preparing for marriage, wishes to emphasize the sacred and serious nature of the marriage covenant. As love joins man and woman, so they are bound more closely to God. With this thought in mind, couples should contact their Pastor well in advance of the wedding date (at least four months).

**ADULT CATECHUMENATE:** The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is open for all who would like to inquire into our Catholic Faith. Those interested may call the Church Office anytime for further information. One's presence in the R.C.I.A. in no way obligates a person to join the Church.

**VISITATION OF THE SICK:** In order to meet the spiritual needs of our sick, we ask that you please keep us informed of those who are ill at home, in the hospital or nursing facility. Please notify the Parish Office. Arrangements can be made for Communion visits to the homes of our homebound parishioners who are unable to attend Mass.

**FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS:** The parish priest is to be contacted before the family makes any arrangements with the funeral director. Family members are also asked to meet with the priest to prepare for the Funeral liturgy.



**REFLECTION FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF STS. PETER AND PAUL, YEAR C**  
(1st Reading, Acts 12:1-11, 2nd Reading, 2 Tim. 4:6-8,17-18; Gospel, Matt. 16:13-19)

Dear brothers and sisters,

**"This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it" (Psalm 118:24).**

**THE PILLARS OF OUR FAITH**

Today, the Church celebrates the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. They were two of the most outstanding apostles who, through their preachings and writings, took the message of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth and especially to the gentile world. They made a significant contribution to the spread and growth of the Christian faith. They suffered persecution and hardships and died as Martyrs for their faith. We can truly call Peter and Paul the pillars of the Christian faith and the Church.

**PETER'S CONFESSION OF FAITH**

In the Gospel, we read of Peter's confession of faith and his revelation of Jesus Christ's identity. To Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am"? Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Peter's answer became fundamental in understanding the identity of Jesus Christ, an answer that Jesus said was not revealed by flesh and blood but by His heavenly Father. Thus, Peter's confession of faith was pivotal in establishing the primacy of Peter and the foundation of the Church – "You are Peter, and upon this rock, I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it" (Matt. 16:18).

Peter took seriously the role of tending and shepherding the flock entrusted to him by Jesus Christ (both in the episode of today's Gospel and in the Tend My Lambs and Feed My Sheep episode) as recorded in the Gospel of John, Chapter 21 verses 15 to 17. He did this by continually preaching and defending the faith, even amid persecution and imprisonment.

Acts of the Apostles 12:1ff is one of the passages that records Peter's imprisonment and is today's first reading. According to the passage, after James, John's brother, was killed, Peter was arrested, kept in prison and secured by double chains. Even though Peter was miraculously released from jail through the intervention of an angel, he nevertheless suffered some hardships and challenges as a result of his imprisonment.

**POURED OUT AS LIBATION**

St. Paul was a surprise apostle, one whose apostleship was unexpected. He referred to himself as "one born abnormally" (1 Cor. 15:8) and as "the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle because he persecuted the Church of God" (1 Cor. 15:9). St. Paul, then known as Saul, was a well-known persecutor of Christians, whose name struck terror into Christians. However, his dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus had a profound impact on the early Church. He transformed from a persecutor of Christians into a leading apostle, especially to the Gentiles.

St. Paul's conversion led to the widespread dissemination of Christian teachings beyond the Jewish community and also shaped Christian theology and spirituality. He was so devoted and committed to the apostolic ministry that he toiled harder than the rest of the apostles (1 Cor. 15:10) and gave it all.

Writing to Timothy as we read in the second reading, St. Paul stated that he is being poured like a libation. To be poured out as libation means a giving of oneself without reserve, to be sacrificed, to be offered, to give it all. Less wonder he stated confidently that what awaits him is the crown of righteousness which the Lord would give to him and all those who have longed for His appearance.

These great apostles were like us, human and frail, but their faith in Jesus Christ became the source of their strength. We can make it to heaven if we continue to look up to them and follow their footsteps and examples.

Always remember that Jesus loves you!

#### **TEN PRACTICAL HINTS IN WELCOMING YOUR NEW PRIEST**

1. **Be patient with him.** The stress of moving, the grief of leaving a familiar parish and the newness of it all might be a bit much for him. **Be Patient.**
2. **Don't beat a path to his door.** Give him some time to unpack, get settled, finding all the bathrooms and getting the secretary's name straight. This might take a month or two, or longer...see #1.
3. **Tell him your name and what you are involved with.** Don't do this once or twice, but a number of times. Don't be offended if in six months or a year later he doesn't remember your name. He wants too. Really! So don't embarrass him, tell him again.
4. **Make sure he has help moving in if he wants it.** The parish secretary can help knowing if he needs help. Some priests would welcome help, others desire privacy. We are all different. A nice welcome basket from the Altar Society or Knights of Columbus is always thoughtful.
5. **Let him change his mind!** Sometimes a decision made early is rushed or made without fully understating the situation. It might be necessary for him to change his mind. Give him some wiggle room.
6. **Try not to compare him to your former pastor.** This will not be fully possible of course, and he will struggle in comparing his previous parish to the present. Comparisons will only impede a relationship.
7. **Tell him your story of the parish, the traditions, and the important values of the parish.** Every parish and tradition in a parish has a story behind it. These stories are important for him to know.
8. **When he asks how something is done in the past or what the protocol is, refrain from telling "Whatever you would like Father!"** We generally want to keep things the way they are and not fix something that is not broken, so don't be afraid to tell him how things operate in the parish. Sometimes a new pastor makes changes without even knowing they have changed anything because no one told him.
9. **Let him get to know you and the parish.** Be sure to invite him to different parish events. Yes, he sees the bulletin and should know when something is happening but he might not know if he is really wanted.
10. **Pray for him and let him know you are praying for him!**

### ST. CECILIA EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP



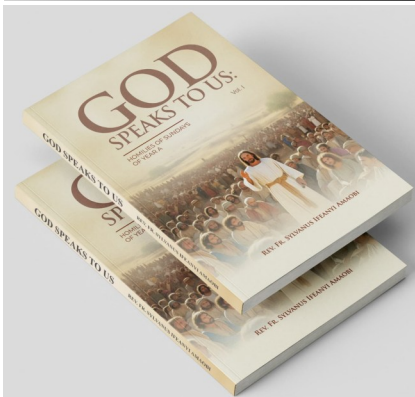
The St. Cecilia Educational Trust Scholarship is an annually renewable college scholarship of at least \$1,000.00.

#### Eligibility:

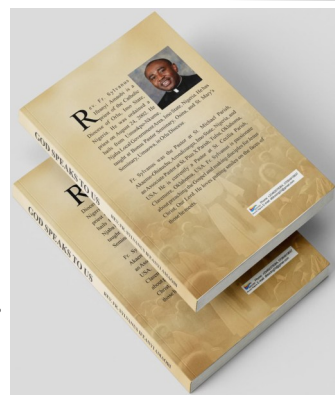
- ♦ A full-time college student with at least 24 credit hours earned.
